The phrase "Listen with the Ear of the Heart" is a central theme in the Rule of St. Benedict, a spiritual guide for monks and nuns in the 6th century. This phrase is often interpreted as a call to listen not just with one's ears, but with the deepest part of one's being, the heart.

According to St. Benedict, listening with the ear of the heart is a disposition of **humility**, **silence**, **and attention**. This kind of listening is not just about hearing words, but about being present to the Divine presence within oneself.
